Week 2 Take-Home: Jonah 2

What We Learned This Week

This week, our kids learned that God doesn't give up on us—even when we run away from Him. Jonah prayed to God from inside the fish, and God heard him. This shows us that no place is too deep, too dark, or too messy for God's grace. God meets us when we mess up and gives us a chance to turn back to Him.

Big Idea for the Week

God's grace reaches us wherever we are.

Bible Verse to Focus On: "Salvation belongs to the Lord." — Jonah 2:9

Talk About It (Family Conversation Starters)

- Why do you think Jonah prayed to God even though he had disobeyed Him?
- Have you ever felt far away from God? What helped you come back?
- What does this story teach us about how God feels about people who make mistakes?

Activity for the Week

The Prayer Pause

Set aside a quiet moment one day this week and invite your child to say a short prayer—out loud or silently—about something they're worried about or something they wish they had done differently. Remind them that God listens anytime we pray, just like He listened to Jonah.

Live It Out

When you mess up this week, remember: you don't have to hide from God. You can talk to Him, say you're sorry, and trust that He still loves you.

Parent Encouragement

Jonah's prayer reminds us that repentance isn't about fear—it's about trust. God's grace meets us in our lowest moments and restores us so that we can be part of His work in the world. Thank you for helping your child learn that God's love never runs out.
